A traineeship can assist you to make this a reality and help you get your SACE. Start your journey with a cyber security traineeship and see what you can achieve in this exciting industry!

The flexible traineeship will enable students to complete their final year of school to achieve their SACE while undertaking an Australian Traineeship at Certificate III level in Information, Digital Media & Technology.

Eligibility

To be eligible to apply candidates must:

- be a current year 11 student entering their final year of high school (completing Stage 2 of their SACE in 2020)
- be enrolled in a Department for Education (government) school
- have completed all compulsory SACE subjects at the completion of year 11.

Qualifications and training

The successful students will complete a specially designed ICT30118 Certificate III Information, Digital Media & Technology which includes Cyber Security electives via TAFE SA Adelaide (city) campus.

Training is expected to start in early 2020 delivered on Wednesdays across the full year, including during school holidays.

About your traineeship

Working days

Trainees will work a minimum of 1 and a maximum of 4 days per week. This will be negotiated with the employer during the recruitment process.

Types of employers

Employers will range from a variety of industry sectors, all requiring ICT & Cyber Security specialists.

Location

The location of your traineeship will be dependent on employer availability. The aim is to align students to employers as local as possible.

Starting date

There will be a rolling start approach as ready students are identified and matched with a suitable employer. We expect to have initial students placed with employers late November / early December 2019.

Travel

It is not a requirement to hold a driver's license to apply for the traineeship program. However, as employer locations will vary across the Adelaide area, the successful students will be required to organise their own transport to their workplace.

Pay

Trainees will be paid for the time spent in the workplace (relevant to the conditions outlined in the appropriate industry award) .

Alternative pathways

Students who are not selected for a traineeship during phase one are encouraged to undertake a VET pathway program in cyber security completing the same ICT30118 Certificate III Information, Digital Media & Technology via TAFE SA VET for schools programs. Please consult your VET coordinator for more information. Students will be notified if additional traineeship vacancies become available in 2020.
