COURSE DESCRIPTION

This Skills Cluster is cybersecurity focused and provides skills and knowledge across information and communications technologies (ICT) and technical functions.

The competencies include techniques for analysing and assessing cyber threats, protecting your own personally identifiable information and promoting cybersecurity awareness.

Students will be tested with a number of short questions, individual and group activities and project work.

PATHWAYS

This course provides students with the essential knowledge, practical skills and industry awareness needed to progress into the **Certificate III in Information Technology (ICT)** offered at Oakbank School. It builds a strong foundation for further training in areas such as cybersecurity and broader ICT pathways, supporting students who wish to continue developing their technical capabilities through the Cert III ICT program.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Students in Year 10 or 11 with a genuine interest in an ICT (Cyber) pathway.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be considered for this course, students should:

- Maintain regular school attendance
- Display appropriate behaviour and a willingness to participate fully
- Show a clear interest in ICT, particularly cybersecurity

Students are expected to attend all classes and engage with the learning and assessment activities.
